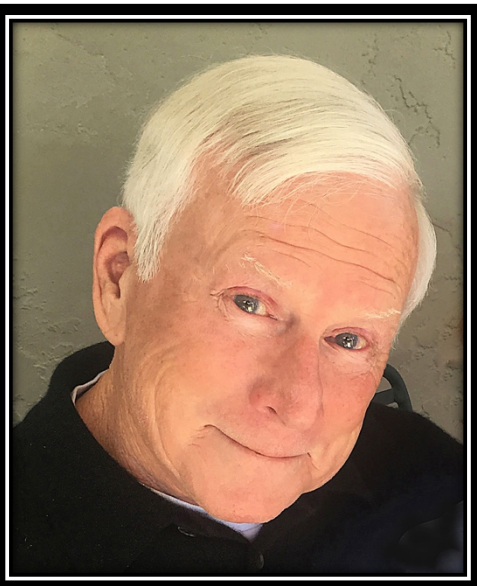

**Wed., August 15th Presentation:
“Photographing Large Marine Animals”
by Ken Howard**

A Marin County resident since 1971, Ken was SCUBA certified in 1972, and got his advanced certification in 1973, the same year he took his first u/w photographs.

His August presentation will feature images of large marine animals taken on recent trips,



including the Revillagigedo Islands (250 mi SW of Cabo) for giant pacific mantas; Dominica (Caribbean) for sperm whales; and Isla Mujeres (near Cancun) for whale sharks and sailfish.

But wait, there’s more! There will be photos and stories for grey whales (Mexico); the Amazon (Brazil) for river dolphins and more; and the San Juan Islands (WA State) for orcas.

He has also won the top prize in photography contests sponsored by *National Wildlife*, *Popular Photography* and *Outdoor California* magazines.

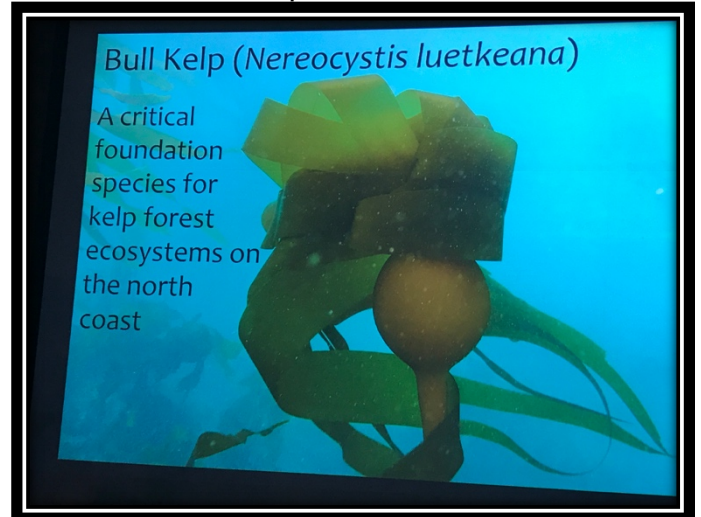


His photo credits (National Geographic, etc.) are too numerous to list, but here's an unusual one on the tail of a Frontier Airlines jet!

July 18th Program Recap: Dr. Cynthia Catton & "Large-Scale Bull Kelp Loss in Northern California"

Dr. Catton presented to a room brimming with kelp enthusiasts. She said a "perfect storm" caused an unprecedented large-scale purple sea urchin explosion in 2015: 60x normal levels that feed on bull kelp.



Straight facts about bull kelp.

That fact, plus warmer seas, a strong El Niño, and a sea star disease that decimated the population of invertebrates that normally eat sea urchins have combined to make 90% of the bull kelp forests in Northern California disappear. But when there's hope, you can help:
