

April 12, 2023 Meeting: Dirk Rosen, "Working With Robot Submarines All Over The World"

Earth's oceans are still vastly underexplored. The deepest place, Mariana Trench in the western Pacific, is more than 36,000 feet deep, while nearby Monterey Canyon is 13,000 feet below the surface. So join us for Dirk's presentation about how he's been using deepsea robots to explore these depths.

Dirk founded Marine Applied Research and Exploration (MARE), a non-profit organization dedicated to filling the knowledge gap of the deepsea, below SCUBA depths, tracking deep sea communities and protecting hotspots of biodiversity and abundance.

Based in Tiburon, CA, MARE:

- Enables intelligent ocean management by bringing science to action to restore the ocean's invaluable, yet threatened resources to support sustainable fisheries for future generations.
- Deploys a fleet of robotic vehicles to explore and document changes to ocean health over time, well beyond the reach of SCUBA divers.
- Has performed an ongoing census of the West Coast from Mexico to the Canadian border, as well as dedicated surveys of the Gulf of Mexico, Hawai'i and Costa Rica.

March Meeting Recap:
Todd Steiner, "Diving Cocos Island
Costa Rica for Conservation Science"

At Todd's return presentation last month as Executive Director of <u>Turtle Island Restoration Network</u> for the past 35 years, he said, "'Cocos Island National Park is very close to my heart. It's a biodiversity mecca, a magical dive spot, and a stop on a superhighway for turtles and sharks, especially hammerheads."

Cocos Island is an incredible Costa Rican possession in the Eastern Tropical Pacific Ocean that:

- Jacques Cousteau called "The most beautiful island in the world"
- Spans only nine square miles
- Is covered by rainforest, cloud forests, and waterfalls, resulting from 27' of rainfall annually
- Is home to about 270 marine fishes, including 27 endemic species of birds, lizards, and freshwater fish and 30 species of eels.

Todd reported that the abundance of wildlife is really amazing, including critically endangered Leatherback Turtle, sharks (hammerhead, silky, tiger), rays (manta, eagle, marbled), tropical fish (small to large), bait balls, schools of jacks, and gray whales.

Dirk Rosen, Continued

About Dirk Rosen.

Dirk has 35+ years of deepsea equipment design, build and operations experience with ROVs, manned submersibles and tow sleds. He's led or co-led 42 ocean expeditions assessing Marine Protected Areas, characterizing National Marine Sanctuaries, performing fish stock assessments, evaluating impacts of wave power, recovering lost equipment at sea, and removing derelict fishing gear.

Previously, he was president of Deep Ocean Engineering, test pilot for all three Deep Rover 1,000 meter-rated manned submersibles, and a co-designer of hundreds of ROVs.

Later, at Hawkes Ocean Technologies, he managed the build of Challenger, an 11,000-meter-rated manned submersible designed to explore the Marianas Trench. Prior to that, he worked with NASA for 5 years, helping to implement robotic standards now used on the International Space Station.

He thought, "What if we could create a protected superhighway for turtles, sharks, and other sea life to swim to/from Costa Rica to the Galapagos Islands?"

Because he's seen a large number of animals since he began diving there in 2007, Todd has been using acoustic tags to track animals for the Cocos-Galapagos Swimway Campaign, one of the world's first bilateral, no-take marine protected areas.

Progress Report: In January 2022, it expanded Ecuador's Galapagos Marine Reserve by more than 23,000-square miles to the borders of Cocos EEZ, and in December, 2021, Costa Rica expanded Cocos Island NP by 53,000 square kilometers. Todd added, "The glass is more than half-full, but our work continues. We're still waiting for a no fishing zone."
