May 10, 2023 Meeting: Eva Paulus, "Deep Sea Fish & Research"

Eva is a marine biologist who has been on five research expeditions to study a broad variety of animals, from large fishes to tiny crustaceans.



Say hello to Eva and her little deep-sea friend.

During her graduate studies, she participated in expeditions to the Azores and Iceland to study deep-sea hydrothermal vents along the Mid-Atlantic Ridge.

Plunging deeper into her studies and the ocean, she spent 74 days on the German research vessel *Sonne* in 2021, learning about the amazing animals living in the mesopelagic zone between 200 and 1000m depth.

Join us on May 10th for her live presentation as Eva shares some of the images captured by nature photographer and biologist, Solvin Zankl, who was able to join two of her most recent expeditions.

April Meeting Recap: Dirk Rosen, "Sustainably Managing an Unexplored Ocean with Submarines"

A lively in-person and Zoom crowd was treated to a variety of images, videos, and anecdotes by Dirk Rosen at our last meeting.



MARE's ROVs have fun, yet functional names: BATfish, Beagle, Lander, Mantis, and Hammerhead.

Dirk said, "Scuba diving was a gateway to my career – first as a diver, next as an instructor, then as an ocean engineer. My first job was working for Sylvia Earle for about 10 years. I realized that overfishing of rockfish and others was getting worse, so I wanted to do something about ocean conservation."

To that end, there are now 124 California Marine Reserves, created by the 1999 Ocean Conservation Act, that protect about 15% of our coastal waters.

His company, Marine Applied Research and Exploration (www.MareGroup.org), was founded to assess ocean health — from the bottom up — and work in the biomass zone. It is involved in:

- Ocean survey planning, and organization
- ROVs, field operations, and technical support
- · Geo-referred analysis of videos
- Post-survey processing, analysis, and reporting
- Tagging sharks to track them between Cocos Island and the Galapagos
- Mapping coral and fighting infections in the BVIs

Thanks in part to MARE's efforts, fish counts have increased by 300% both inside <u>and</u> outside of reserves, they've helped replant deep sea gorgonian sponges for medical uses in antibiotics and cancer drugs, and they've helped protect 30% of reefs in the Hawaiian Islands, especially Maui.

July, Lake Tahoe, A weekend of hiking, biking, and diving. CANCELLED as campsite are sold out.


