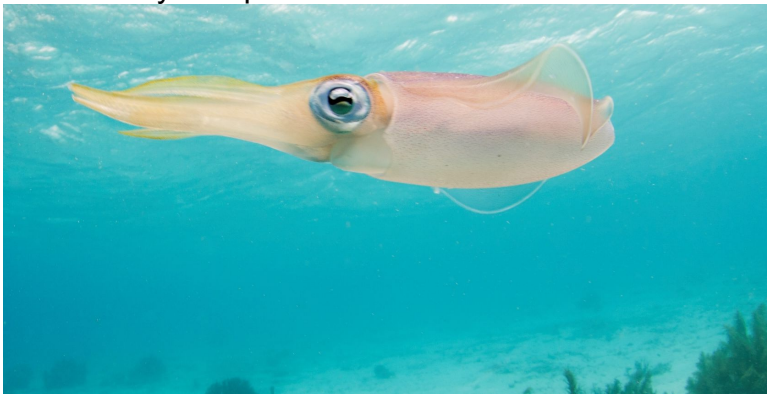

Member Spotlight: Charlie Hunter

We interviewed Charlie, a 12-year member of MSC. He was also a member of the San Francisco Flipper Dippers for many years.

I am NAUI-certified Open Water One since April 1984. My first dive was off of the *Conception* out of Santa Barbara. I was certified with my instructor, Andy Bodgan.



He couldn't believe when he found out on the way down there that I had purchased *all my equipment* before having ever done a dive. He asked what happens if you don't like it. My response was "I know I will." And I was right.

Warm & Cold Water Dives.

I expect I have done about an equal number of warm and cold water dives. My favorite diving is the kelp beds of the Channel Islands. I find there is far more life there to experience than in the warm water diving.

I have also dived many areas of the Florida Keys and in Mexico, such as Isla Mujeres, Cabo San Lucas, Guaymas and Puerto Vallarta. In Guaymas, I had the opportunity to snorkel with the whales and a trip to a seal sanctuary to play with the pups.

Northern California native and filmmaker Mischa Hedges presented portions of his award-winning documentary "Of The Sea: Fishermen, Seafood and Sustainability" at our April meeting.

Mischa explained, "Has your seafood traveled 10,000 miles before you eat it? About 90% of the seafood consumed in the U.S. is imported."

My favorite diving and snorkeling trips.

I've been to the Hawaiian Islands a number of times, one of which was a drift dive over a group of hammerhead sharks was one of my most memorable dives recently.

I have dove off of many Caribbean Islands, although I don't remember where. I dove in Lake Tahoe. I was on the scuba trip this year with the club to Bonaire, which was an amazing week.

One of my favorite dive trips ever was a week in the Cayman Islands. Perhaps because it was a trip early in my diving experience, I always remember it as one of the greatest, but nothing beats the abundance of life of the kelp beds in the Channel Islands. I probably made over 18 boat trips out of Santa Barbara over the years.

Dolphins Are Getting High on Blowfish

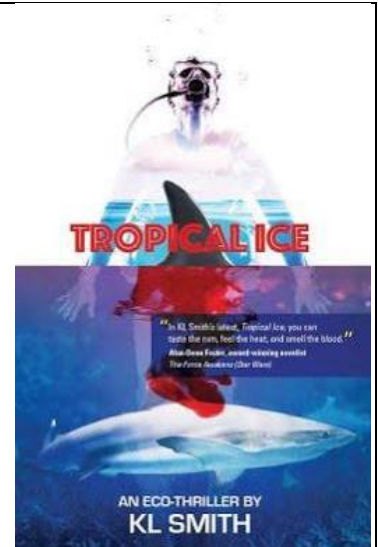
They even pass them to their friends for a hit. Blowfish contain the toxin tetrodotoxin in their skin, flesh and internal organs, lethal to most predators, including humans, but not to dolphins. In small doses, it can have a narcotic effect and is used as a recreational drug.

Researchers at Murdoch University, Perth, have caught dolphins using the toxins. The poison causes them to enter a trance-like state at the surface, but they could just be using the fish to play. See more: <http://tinyurl.com/jgcae3d>

"Tropical Ice" by Ken Smith – Reviewed by Larry Clinton

Ken Smith's first novel, "Tropical Ice," is quite a thriller. In Chapter 1, during a shark feeding dive in Belize, a severed human arm emerges from an icy "chumsicle." Dive operator Jack Africa tries to solve that mystery while the authorities shut down his Rum Caye Resort as a crime scene. Meanwhile Jack's old buddy, Matt Oliver, arrives on assignment to write an article on "beautiful Belize." Oliver is an ex-environmental activist turned travel writer (that might sound familiar to Ken's friends) – but as he tries to help his friend, Oliver uncovers a tangled web of corruption, exploitation, and traffic in local endangered species.

Ken's evocative writing style puts the reader right in the moment – from a Belize City fleabag to a fundraising banquet in a luxury Washington D.C. hotel. Pages turn fast as Matt encounters one villain after another. Waterstreet Press is the publisher.
