Saving Them From Overfishing
and The Shark Fin Trade”

David McGuire is the founder and director of the Ocean Health and Shark Conservation nonprofit Shark Stewards. He’s earned an enviable reputation as a sailing captain, dive master, filmmaker, educator and ocean explorer, producing media with an emphasis on shark conservation and ocean awareness.

His September presentation will feature updates about <http://www.SharkStewards.org>, which has worked to establish shark fin regulations in 12 U.S. states since 2006, and is currently supporting the U.S. Shark Fin Trade Elimination Act.

Shark Stewards’ mission is to restore ocean health by saving sharks from overfishing and the shark fin trade, as well as by protecting critical marine habitats through the establishment of marine protected areas and shark sanctuaries from California to Southeast Asia. It also supports our National Marine Sanctuaries and Marine Monuments through education and policy.

Great Barrier Reef:

Bad News For The Wonder Down Under

Everyone knows that the GBR is one of the world's treasures for snorkeling and scuba diving.

But not for much longer. John "Charlie" Veron, 73, AKA "The Godfather of Coral", who has personally discovered nearly 25% of the world's coral species and has spent 45 years diving here, told CNN: "It's the beginning of a planetary catastrophe.

In 2016 and 2017, marine heat caused by climate change has resulted in mass bleaching. Though no bleaching occurred in the summer of 2018, about half of the CBR's corals are now dead. He even said, "coral reefs are on death row".

Ken thoroughly entertained a full room of big marine animal enthusiasts, with one amazing image after another, accompanied by his humorous and informative stories.

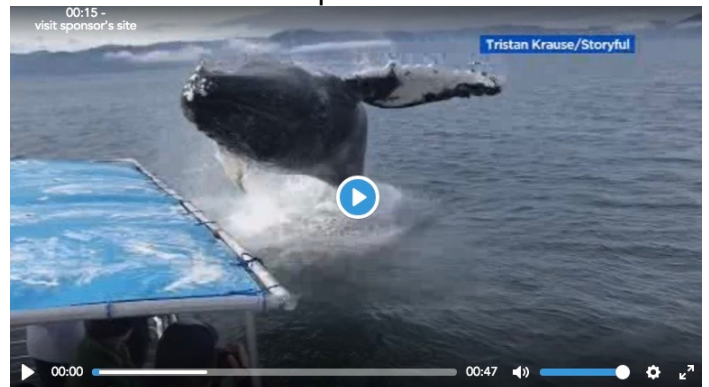


*Dominica Sperm Whales:
