January Meeting: Vince Smith – “Blue Endeavors and Citizen Science Underwater”

For our first 2020 meeting, Vince Smith, a lifelong diver with a background in marine science and education, will tell us about Blue Endeavors.



Vince will host a giant oceanic manta ray event on February 1st.

“People who regularly dive notice climate change, pollution, more acidification and other man-made afflictions—and they’re worried,” says Vince.

Smith and his volunteer team founded Blue Endeavors in 2012 to promote global ocean conservation.

“Species have disappeared from some of my favorite diving spots”, he notes. “It really highlights the need for more action, now. But it’s going to take decades—at minimum—of effort, invention and awareness to restore or even to slow the damage to the Earth’s oceans.”

New Year, New Rates: Membership Fees Are Higher to Accommodate Rising Costs

For the first time in at least 10 years, MSC is raising our annual dues to help cover rising costs of hosting monthly meetings, events, and parties.



MSC membership has its rewards.

Effective 01/01/20, our annual fee for an individual membership will go up 20% to \$50, while couples living at the same residence will pay \$79. These fees are in effect through the Early Bird Special Rates of 2/29/20 to renew or join MSC.

But if you wait until after 4/1/20, you’ll pay a late fee of \$10 more, so that will cost you \$60 for an individual membership and \$89 for a couple.

Blue Endeavors was launched to offer a unique array of training courses, mentorship programs and scholarships. They're all available to foster the next generation of leaders and innovators in ocean conservation.

In August 2017, BE opened its first dive facility at Alameda's South Shore. "That cemented our standing as one of the Bay Area's premiere marine-focused community centers," adds Vince.

Besides serving as a waterfront base for their activities, it also includes a full SCUBAPRO Platinum dive shop. Best of all, all proceeds go directly back to this non-profit organization.


