February Meeting Recap: Jim Hellemn, "25 Years Focused On Cayman Coral Reefs"

Virginia Bria provided these notes; our editor thanks her! Jim Hellemn did an outstanding presentation of his underwater imaging, showing us the many dive sites he has explored over the years in the Cayman Islands.

He presented the images he took with his highly sophisticated computers, cameras and lighting systems, used both during the day and at night in over 4000 dives logged over the years. He also presented the vibrant work he completed using fluorescent lights to demonstrate nightlife that may not be visible during the day and uncover marine life seldom seen.

Used by Scientists to Determine Coral Species

The changes that occurred over the years on many of the sites he has photographed repetitively have been used by scientists to determine both the gain and loss in species of corals.

It was fascinating to see how he takes literally hundreds of images from a large swath of reef underwater and transforms these into an incredibly detailed photographic tapestry often extremely large scale. This requires both stamina and attention to capture the reef so precisely and create a photograph that spans a scale of often 12' x 125' such as his image of the California Kelp Forest at the entrance of the Aquarium of the Pacific in Long Beach.

Most of his earlier work was taken from film images (some with the trusty old Nikonos camera!) that had to be scanned over the years.

He believes that some of his best images for sharpness were from his earlier film work. He currently uses digital cameras.

The first stop was Anilao and it was spectacular!

We saw the blue ring octopus, mating eels (shown on the left), famous gurnard walking fish, peacock manta shrimp and much more.

This site is also considered to be the nudibranch capital and we enjoyed many beautiful gastropods. Most of us also did some excellent Black Water diving where we saw many juveniles, including an octopus and nautilus. The Buceo Anilao Beach and Dive Resort was five stars: excellent service and a great shop.

The next stop was Puerto Galera and the El Galleon Dive Resort. Again, it was a wonderful dive operation. While there is an overlap of marine life, this site offers more current, so we enjoyed large schools of blue tangs, several pygmy seahorse, cuttlefish and huge turtles.

A Few Presentation Highlights

One of the highlights of his presentation was the use of his image to create and incredible inlaid mosaic tile mural, 25 ft x 75 ft high of a coral reef for the <u>Camana Bay Observation Tower</u>, a five-story public attraction in Grand Cayman, where visitors can now "walk" up a coral reef.

The other was for a private client in the Caymans who are lining their pool which required computers and robots to emulate his photographs and create the mosaic tiles: https://artaic.com/installations/cayman-islands-residence/
