

"Safe Diving For Seniors"

Dan Orr, President of Dan Orr Consulting, has been diving for over 60 years, since JFK was in the White House.

He created a college-level diver education program at Wright State University (Dayton, Ohio), was an Associate Diving Safety Officer (DSO) at Florida State University, and retired as President of Divers Alert Network (DAN) where he helped focus its worldwide diving safety mission.



Dan has been an invited speaker at numerous national and international diver conferences and conducts regular webinars for global audiences on diving safety subjects.

He has published, co-authored and contributed to more than a dozen books and manuals including:

September Meeting Recap: Walter Marti, "A Decade Of Blackwater Diving Images"


Walter began blackwater diving in 2011 when he wanted to try something different with his Kona dive buddies. They made a 100-foot downline with sliding John-Lines, added weights for a sense of security, then attached a sea anchor to keep the line in place and prevent drifting away.



Every blackwater dive is filled with discovery.

He said, "Every night, the Diel Vertical Migration, the largest on Earth, happens as creatures from the deep rise to the surface. We are just scratching the surface of the Deep Scattering Layer of the Biological Carbon Dump, a process that relocates 10 gigatons of carbon annually, the equivalent of a year's worth of U.S. energy consumption."

He added, "Blackwater diving is very challenging to maintain buoyancy and spot images, many of which may be macro size. The best places are in or on the edge of a canyon, or at the end of a large 800- to 1,000-foot shelf."
